- ITLC requested more specifics about frequency of reporting back. There will now be biannual group presentations.
- Action Item: New charge approved with ITLC modifications.

## SCORM – Jim Phillips

- UCSC, compliant with LMS but never enabled it.
- Costs about \$4k a year plus \$1500 to implement
- What are other campuses doing with SCORM?
  - Mary Ellen: used Sakai for one course in particular, had difficulty making it SCORM compliant, went to another solution
  - o Dan: UCSD enables SCORM only on rare occasions
  - o Paul and Israel: SCORM demand from faculty is rare

## Google+ User Agreement - David Levin

- License terms covered by consumer use
- When Google Apps was enabled, it was unlikely that any data would be shared, but need clarification on best practices for faculty and students.

- Stephen Lau is looking into it further, may present to ETLG at a later meeting
- Possibly suggest idea to ITLC of a new task force
- **Jeff-** ELTG could form a group on our own and choose to share its work with ETLG later when we have a better sense of direction.
- Rose- CA law that cannot require students to utilize their private social media accounts in class
- **Jim:** we want to be careful, but also don't want to push faculty away from using our services
- **Jenn** we want to provide guidance to faculty about risks instead of discouraging use of online tools
- Action Item: David will reach out to Stephen Lau
- Action Item: Jenn and David will send out a call to ELTG for members interested in forming a group (Mary Ellen volunteered already), and will schedule a meeting in the next 2 weeks
