## DISCUSSION

### ANNOUNCEMENTS

- Jeff – described a policy change on distance education (Remote Instruction) at UCSD. The UCSD Academic Senate decided to revise the policy so that it is less restrictive – Senate discussion involved whether it is appropriate to hold Remote Instruction to higher quality standards (do campuses have to create a separate standard for DE? – UCSD ultimately said no – standards are determined by the faculty we hire).
- Jim will present to ITLC briefly on September 21
- Jim is joining Electronic Accessibility Leadership Team (EALT) – and we can look for ways to draw our groups together.

### Presentation of Electronic Accessibility Leadership Team (Christine Bagwell)

Christine Bagwell presented on the work to date of the **Electronic Accessibility Leadership Team**. Christine is inaugural chair of the EALT. They have tried to look at the lay of the land and to get an inventory for what is needed. After a notable Chronicle article that ranked campuses on web accessibility, EALT was prompted to scan and to quantify where each campus is currently at. In a report to go to ITLC imminently, EALT observes some improvement in web accessibility (based on initial efforts) and provides a roadmap to further success.

EALT has tried to narrow the scope of the work to focus on the accessibility of a few web sites on each campus, so that the work is do-able and not so overwhelming. UC – security committee – created policy and guidelines (Steven Lau, chair) on web accessibility. The policy will be ready for review by the end of 2011 – and will shoot for 100% WCAG ([Web Content Accessibility Guidelines](#)) compliance level A (where AAA = highest). The guidelines will also call on campuses to create a local committee and identify a campus coordinator. But overall, the EALT is encouraging reasonable progress in the right direction, recognizing the impact of budget cuts and staffing reductions.

EALT also spent some time this past year on procurement and training as well. They suggested changes to RFP language, and are (re) considering the sufficiency of vendor VPATs, etc. EALT has also worked with various systemwide / IT groups and solicited input from advocacy groups. Along the way, they identified some accessibility problems with staff LMS, UC Sexual Harassment Training; and electronic payroll stubs (to name but a few).

The UC system will purchase a tool to simplify scanning for web accessibility. The name of this tool is “SSB Bart – AMP.” More info at: <https://www.ssbartgroup.com/amp/index.php>

ETLG members should feel free to route problems and issues to the EALT – the “abled” community are pretty understanding and want things to work – so that helps.

Christine mentioned that some campuses have received Environmental Health and Safety grants.

At UC San Diego, they have focused their recent training efforts on a few specific areas: Captioning, Universal Design and Web Accessibility.

In November – additional web accessibility training will be made available systemwide to web programmers.

National Federation of the Blind is targeting universities as a way to get vendors to create accessible products. Pete Siegel recently spoke at the National Federation of the Blind. Of note, students have sued over clickers, LMS access, etc.

Jim also spoke with Katina Ancar (Counsel in the Office of the General Counsel) and she is advising campuses to prioritize students who are trying to gain access to systems / info – the main thing is that it is important to **respond immediately when faced with an issue that impedes student academic progress**. UC Office of General Counsel is aware that we are facing numerous challenges in this area and will need to prioritize what we work on next at the campus level.
