1. Roll call at 1:05 pm (Jeff)
2. Status: Click Through Agreements (Mary-Ellen)
 - ITLC subcommittee draft has been prepared
 - Mary-Ellen asked where campus security groups get involved in free security agreements
 - UC Irvine: had to have some conversations in an instance where data needed to be used appropriately in the instance of Piazza as used through LMS. Faculty do not have to tell them if they're using a free service with a click-through service, but is a goal moving forward
 - UC Berkeley: security team only gets involved when asked. However, faculty can bring in tools in Canvas themselves without realizing what data they're sharing when they do
 - UC San Diego: do have some ability to restrict what information Piazza gets when used through an LMS as an administrative tool
 - UCLA: working with Canvas to institute standards for third-party tools inside LMS to regulate click-through agreements through "CASA-compliance"
 - ITLC is aware that the system-level purchasing process has not kept up with what happens at the faculty and student level. May be worthwhile to get the ITLC's perspective on how they see things happening
 - It is easier to make progress at the campus level working with local campus counsel
 - Add to the agenda for the second day of the in-person meeting. Discuss a centralized resource of best practices
3. Re-review of in-person meeting items suggested in the May call (all)
 - a. Captioning and accessibility approaches and funding

- Could benefit students broadly, not just those with disabilities, as could have use in general instruction
 - No agreement on best tool to use, need to do more research into what is viable
 - Not sure much to discussion, but could discuss how to get more funding to support
 - Do any UCs other than UC Berkeley have a large number of videos and screencasts that do not have any captions (except where requested by students)? UC San Diego does the same as UC Berkeley in terms of numbers and what is captioned, but doesn't distribute podcasts as widely
 - There is some urgency to reviewing captioning because of formation of a task force with a fall quarter completion date
 - Focus on reviewing tools that are actually working for the in-person meeting
 - May be a good topic for Tom to hear
- b. Student technology fee funding models
 - Move to July phone call meeting
 - **Action item:** Shoreh and Jenn will do a brief survey regarding tech fees in advance of July phone meeting and share the results at that time
 - c. Demo of CASA
 - Straight forward, do on either day
 - d. Third-party tools in the LMS
 - Will be handled by broader conversation on click through agreements, no longer needed
 - e. Set aside an hour to do five or ten minute demos of things that people want to show off
 - Tom seems to be interested in what specific campuses are doing, this could be a good way to showcase what campuses are doing with faculty for him
 - Originally suggested by Jenn more for the benefit of the ETLG members instead of Tom
 - f. Educational data analytics
 - Discussion of who is doing anything with their analytics
 - Tied to external, third-party tools and how to get data out of them
 - Discuss one day one to collect initial thoughts and then discuss further with a concise presentation of thoughts on day two
 - Reserve some time on the first day for the discussion of committee-only discussion
 - **Action item:** George and Jeff will come up with a rough draft agenda for in-person meeting for the July phone meeting

 6. Campus update – San Diego (Dan)
 - ILTI:
 - ACMS is working closely with 3 ILTI grants projects funded to ~\$500k

- ECON A B C: A three course series. The largest and biggest ACMS time investment.
 - New Service Innovations: Course jointly developed with UCSD, UCM, and UCOE
 - Digital Rhetoric: Course developed by UCOE, with video production at ACMS
 - ACT and Registrar working to have cross-enrollment enabled by late September
 - There will be another ILTI call in Fall 2014.
 - As a result of ILTI work and the grape vine, ACMS is receiving several requests to provide video and course support
 - 4k camera purchased
 - Still a lot of interest in Learning Glass
- LMS
 - Blackboard Learn license expiring. Currently gathering new price quotes.
 - Experiencing steady LMS use growth (1000 courses expected this Fall 2014), partially due to improved support and wider marketing.
 - Recently migrated two UCSD departments and courses from their in-house disparate LMS'.
 - LMS Advisory Group Spring meet canceled due to unforeseen poor timing and attendance. Will try again in Summer.
 - Recently developed new ways to interpret our LMS user survey data. Dan will share with group next week if desired.
- Podcasting
 - Slow but steady growth in use (~125 courses/quarter)
 - Our devs have been making very useful tweaks to the UI
- Instructional design
 - Attitude slowly changing with regard to ID and pedagogy. ACMS is increasingly being asked to help with course re-design.
- Learning and Teaching Commons
 - Campus-wide Education Initiative groups have put forth a new center for learning and teaching support.
 - Its gaining traction and support rapidly.
 - In this proposal, ACMS would be part of the a "commons" of instructional technology, along with Library and other relevant units. This may affect physical space, but not reporting lines.
