3. Irvine	We have a blended environment. Google Apps for education/Gmail for all students and its also available to faculty and staff. We offer Exchange/O365 for staff as well as faculty.
4. Los Angeles	The mobile device is a good aggregator...
5. Merced	All users currently receive 10Gb of cloud storage on Box. Faculty are allowed up to 50Gb at no cost. Department group accounts are provided 100Gb. We are also looking into enabling the OneDrive for Business licenses for our MS Office 365 tenant.
6. Riverside	Strong possibility we will be moving all Faculty and Staff to GAFE in a year for email, calendaring, collaboration, and cloud storage.
7. San Diego	We're actively working with central and divisional IT departments to offer GAE for all students. Target date is Fall 2015.

9. Santa Barbara	Campus had decided to switch all faculty and staff to Office/365 for email and calendaring, and that transition was to begin in December 2013. Due to significant problem with Microsoft support for both back-end maintenance and the transition; those plans were scrapped. Campus is back in an evaluation cycle for possible solutions for faculty and staff for both email and calendaring.
10. Santa Cruz	When we consider 3rd party solutions for various intents, we are now asking if they can integrate with Google calendar. As you know, I have some concerns about the rapid iteration of Google products and the consequent effects on accessibility... but I don't seem to be getting much traction. We will likely turn on Google Classroom soon but do not intend to connect to our SIS, so I'm not sure how it might be used.
